Someday I want to help others like you have helped me. I hope that one day anyone that needs something can obtain it and that all can realize their dreams. God bless all of you."

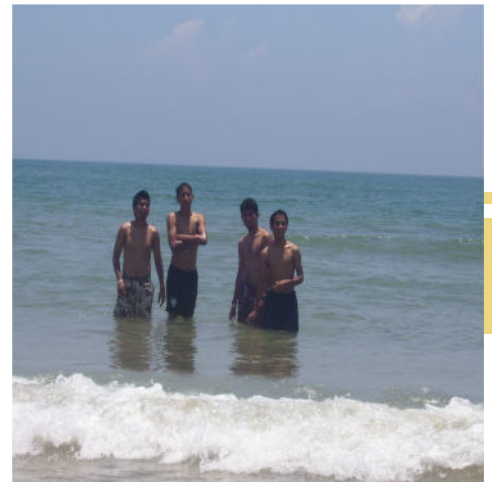
